

Supply of Take Home Naloxone in Wales






Supply rate of THN to new and existing individuals




THN supply to new individuals by role

Recommendations

- 'Ensure expansion of the existing Take-Home Naloxone programme in order to improve coverage and distribution. Models of delivery should include but not be limited to:
 - provision on an opt-out bases through community pharmacy NSP services, primary and secondary care settings and all prisons,
 - development of peer distribution networks
 - Police and first responder carriage
- 'Consider reclassifying THN as an over-the-counter medication^{b'} - underway







50% increase in non-drug misuse poisonings with substantial geographic variation – EASR per 100,000 population by Health Board area of residence






Rate of drug misuse deaths per million population in Wales compared to specified regions in England, 2002 to 2021




Drug misuse deaths by Welsh Index of Multiple Deprivation (WIMD)






Drug misuse deaths by gender 2012-2021










Heroin/Morphine

Heroin is the most commonly reported substance with **93** deaths

Highest number/rate in Cwm Taf (n=28/EASR 6.6 per 100,000 population)






Figure: Heroin/morphine drug misuse deaths involving different substance groups by year of registration, 2017 to 2021.




Benzodiazepines

68 deaths involving Benzodiazepines – second after heroin

Most common substances were Flubromazolam (n=21) and Diazepam (n=20) deaths

95% of benzodiazepine deaths involved at least one other substance







Figure: Deaths involving Benzodiazepines and additional substance groups by year of registration, 2017 to 2021, Wales



Cocaine

Involved in <u>47</u> deaths in 2021 – 22% of all drug misuse deaths



Cannot differentiate between powder and crack cocaine




Figure: Drug misuse deaths involving cocaine as the only substance reported, and cocaine alongside at least one other substance, by year of death registration, 2012-2021






Figure 22: Drug misuse deaths in Wales with multiple substances recorded, 2021 to 2010





Known Contact with Services



- Known to have been in contact with any service within 12 months prior to death 60%
- 'No known contact' or no contact with services within 12 months prior to death was reported in 40 per cent of cases
