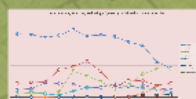

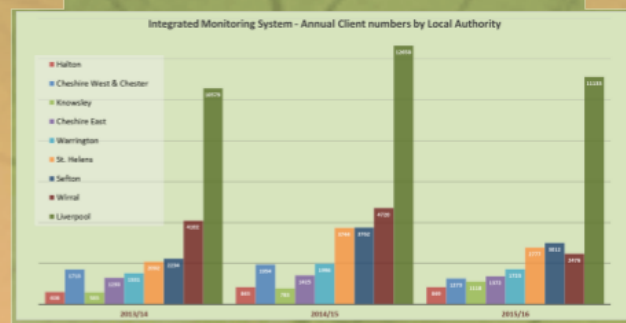

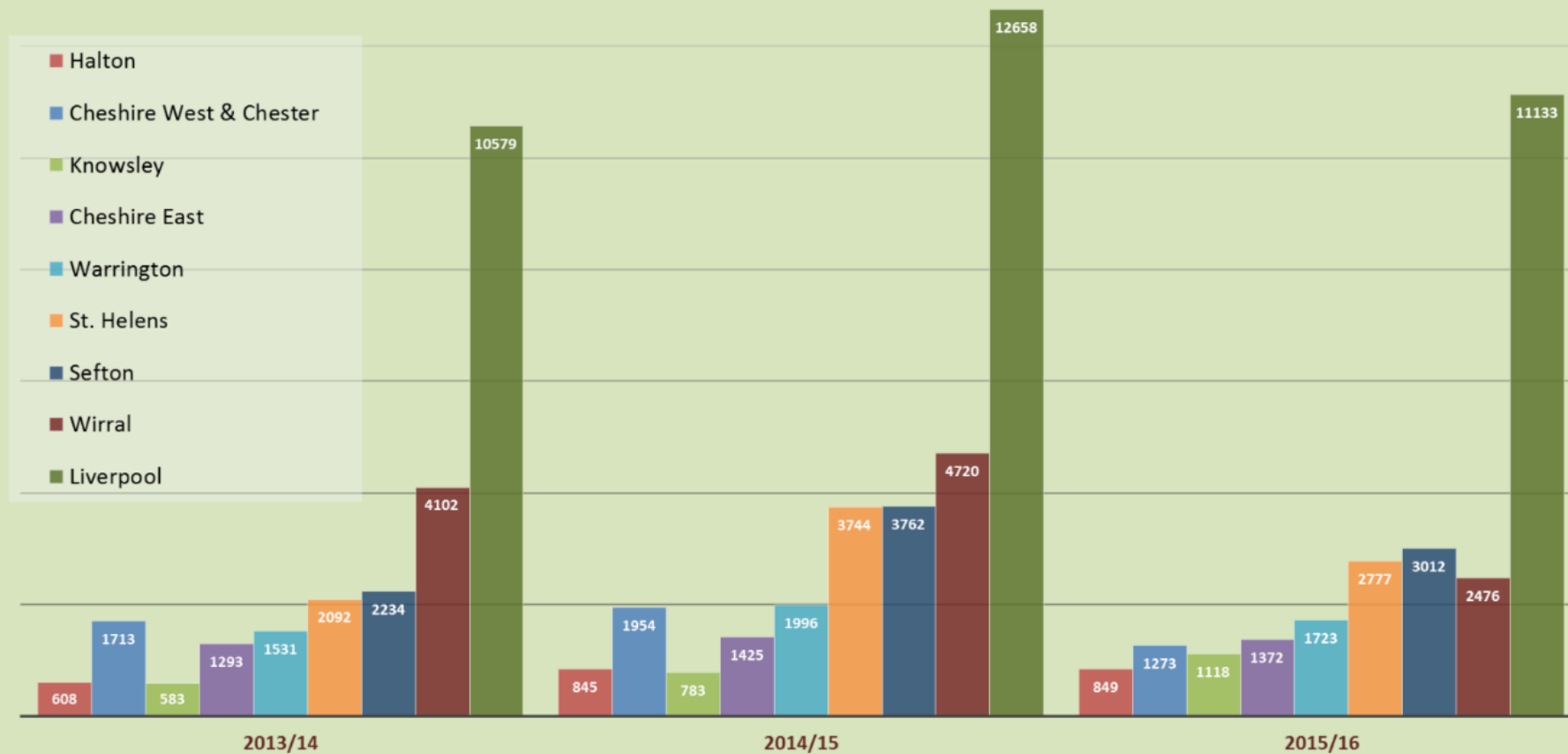

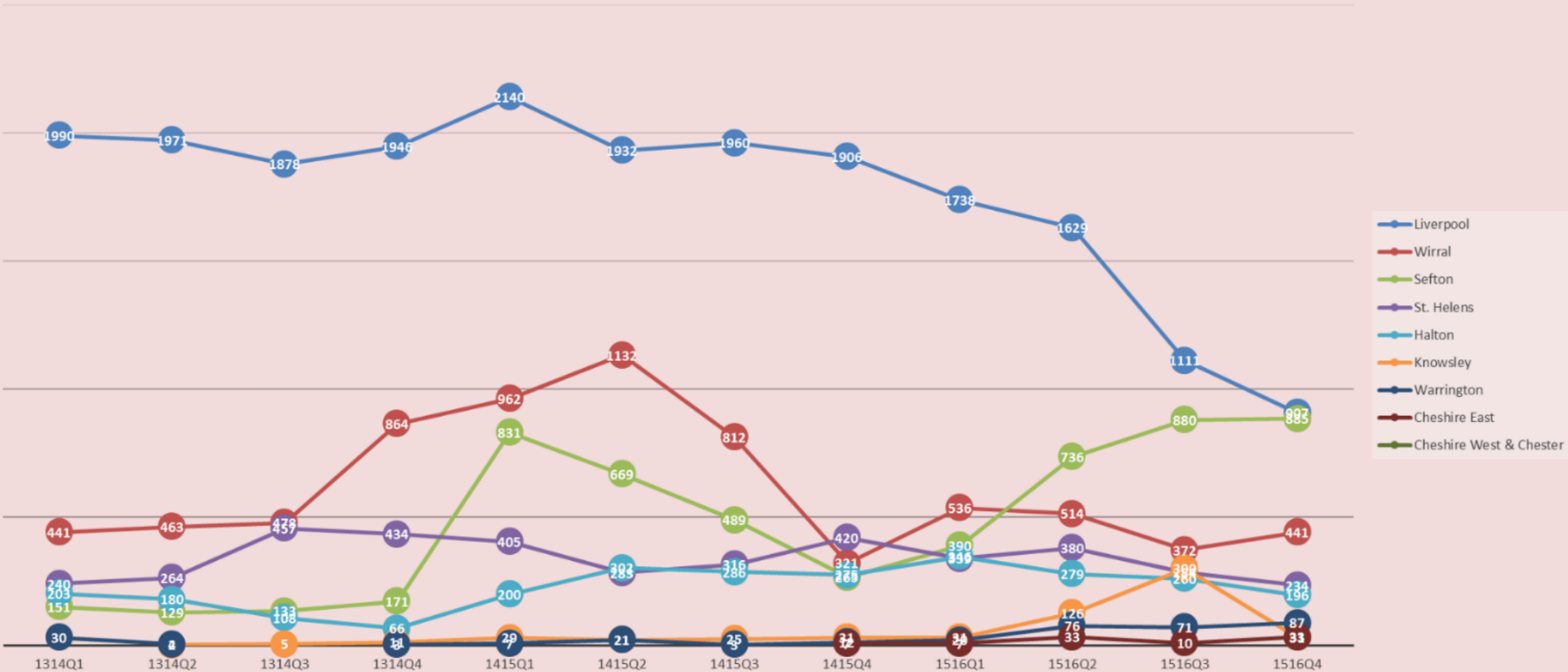
Integrated Monitoring System - Annual Client numbers by Local Authority

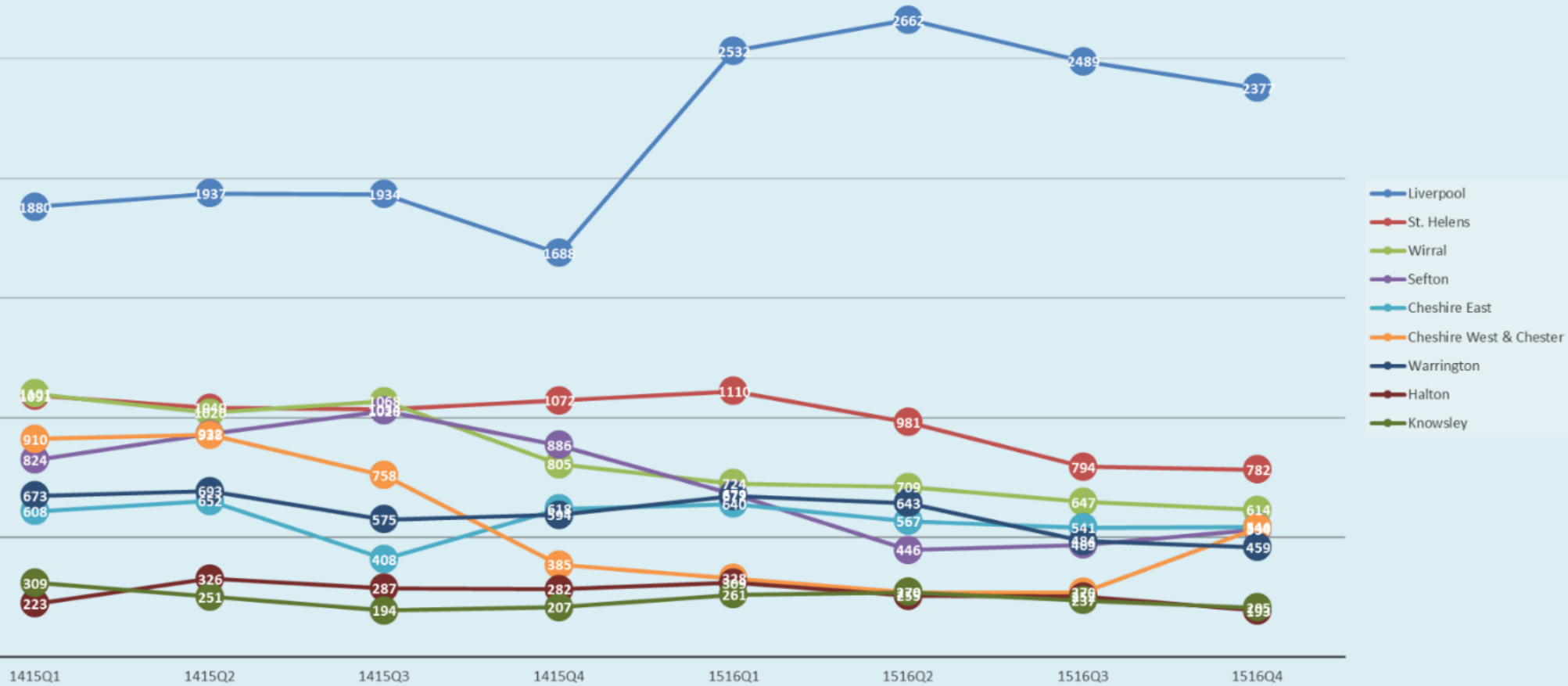

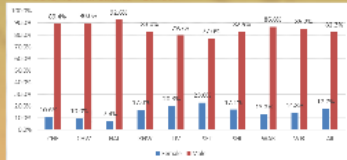

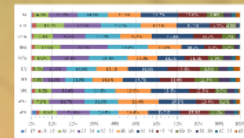
IMS 2015-16 : All Clients - Main Substance

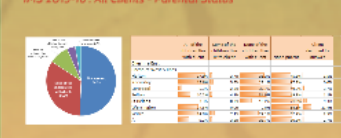
IMS 2015-16 : All Clients - Age Group

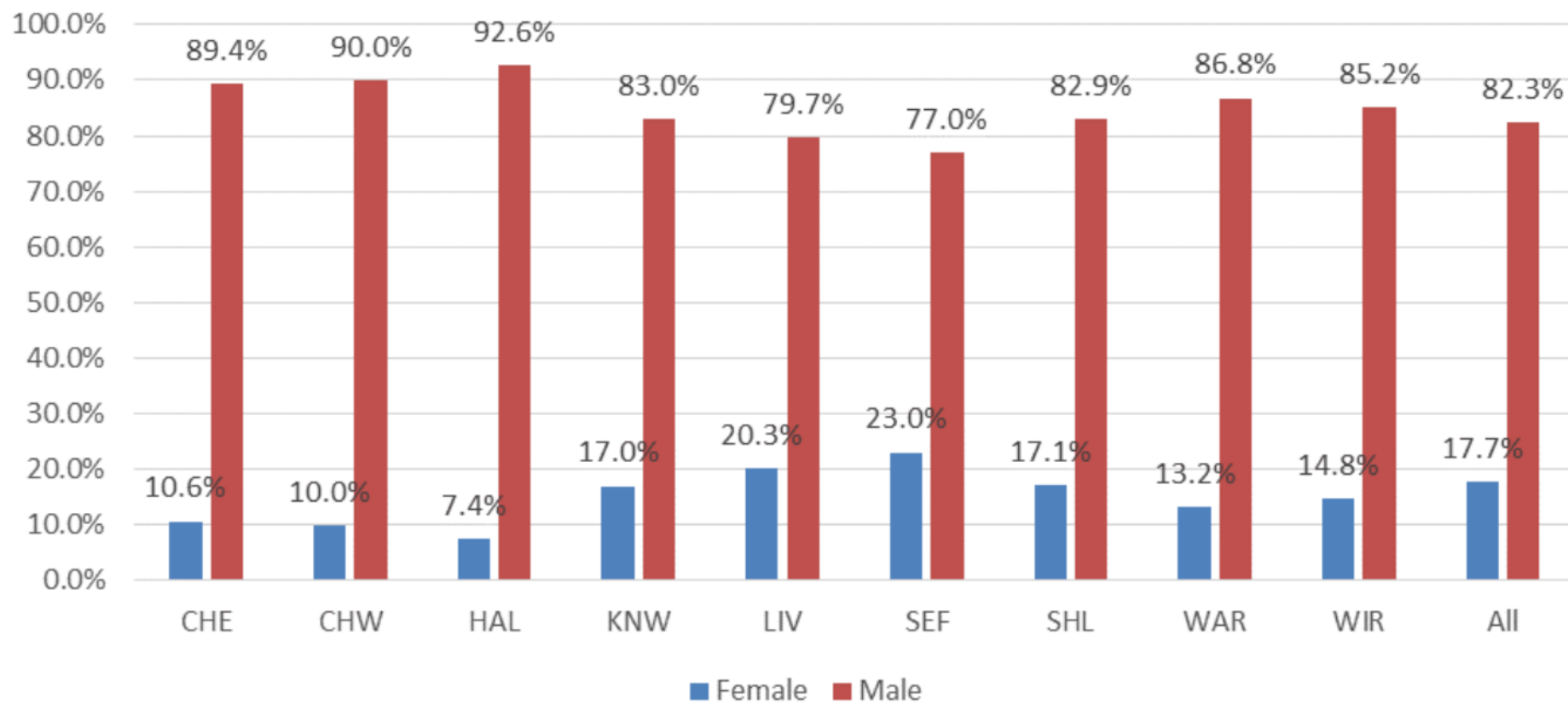

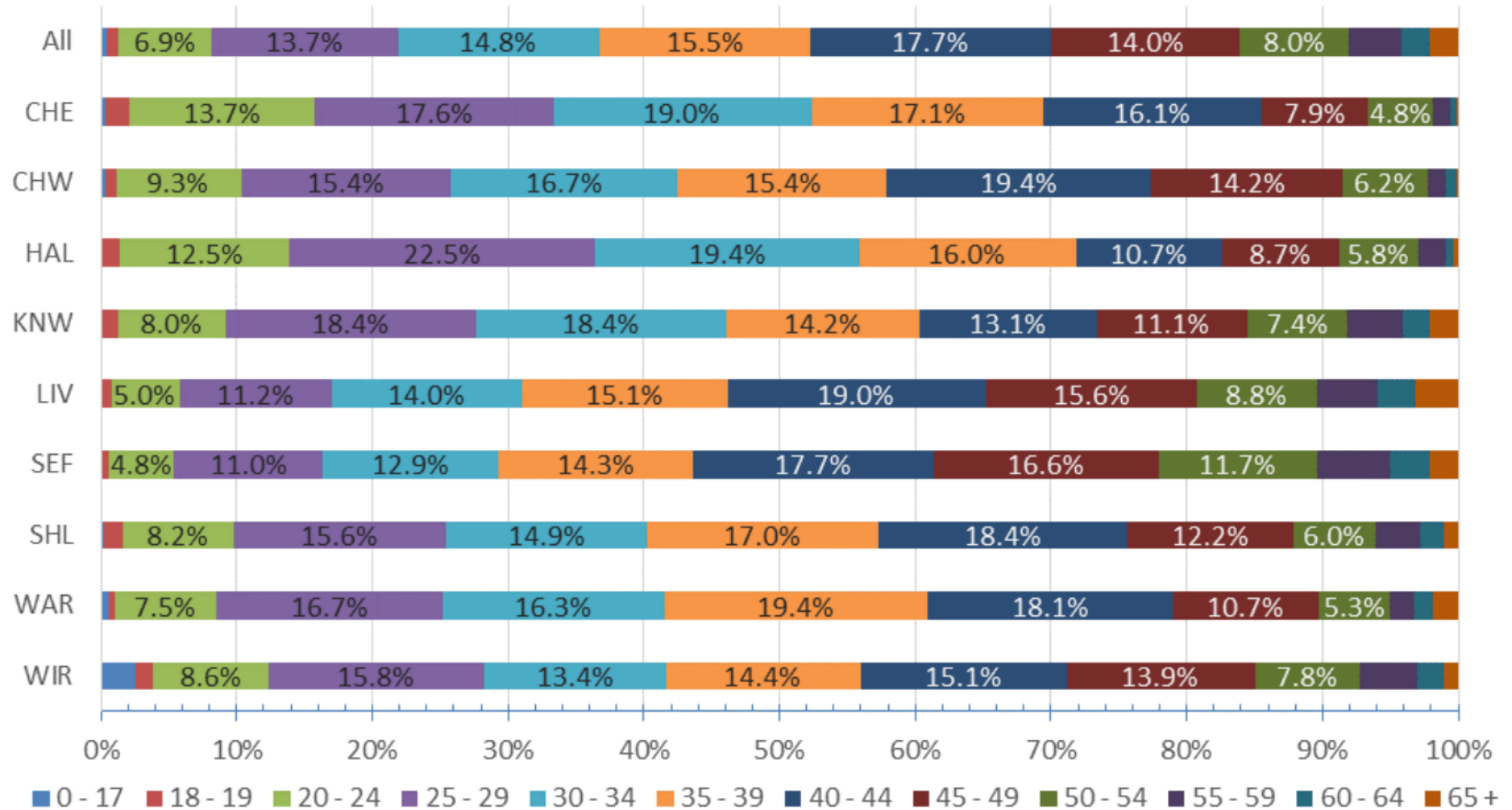

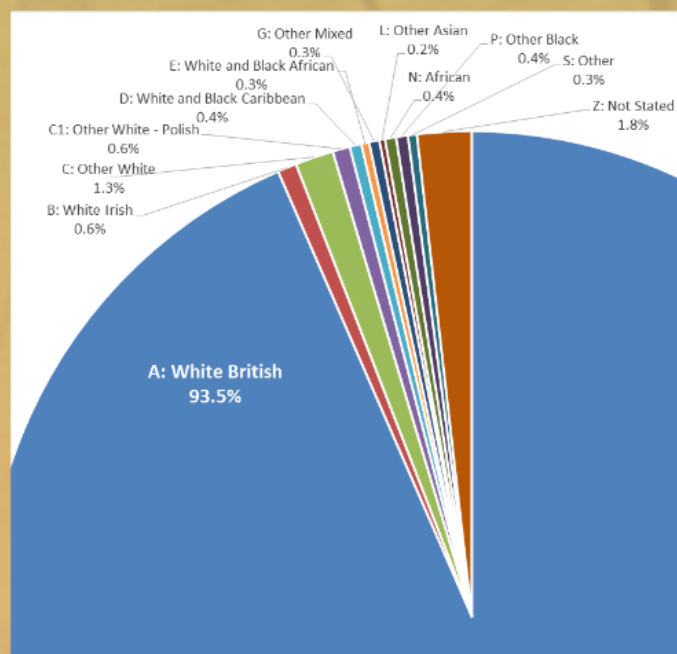

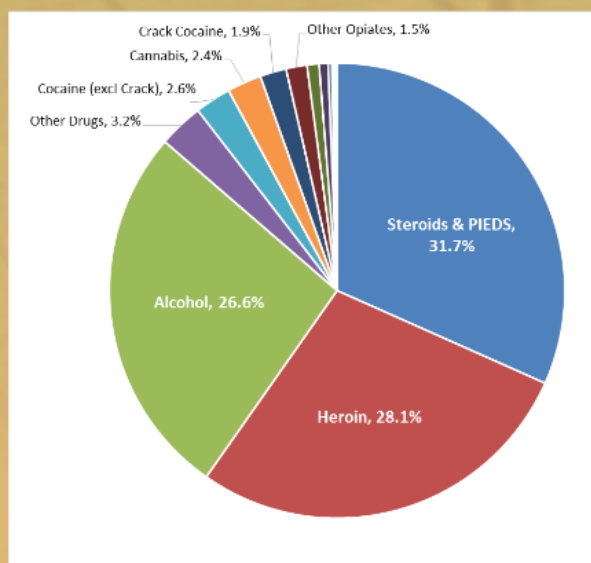

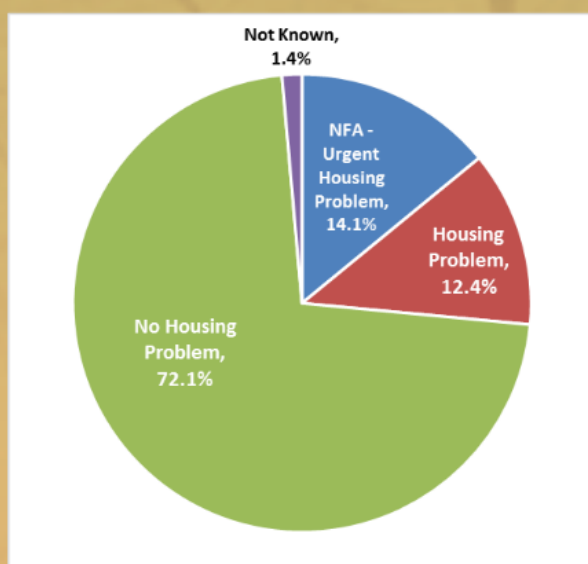

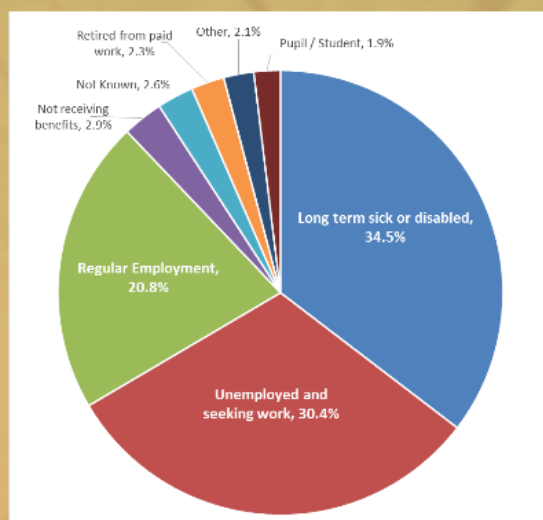

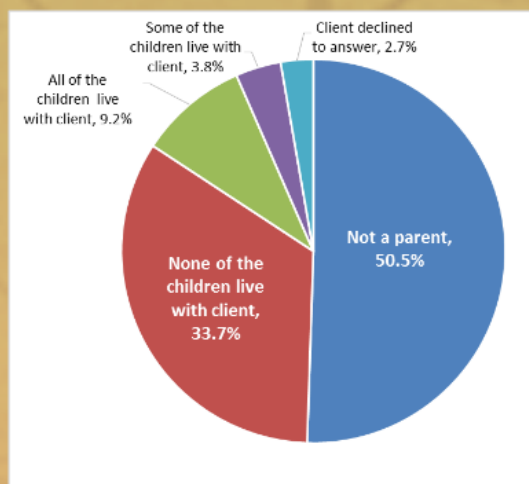

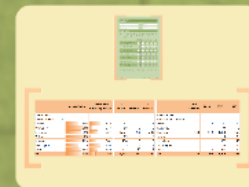
