DATA NOTES

Analysis of client data for the production of this report is dependent on the provision of attributable information. Each service records the client's initials, date of birth and gender, the combination of these data items provides an identifier or attributor for that client.

Data has been excluded where a valid attributor has not been provided for example gender was not completed.

Clients have been excluded where the date of birth was left blank or the date entered indicated the client was under 9 or over 75 years old.

A small number of clients have more than one 'Main Drug' recorded, this can caused either by clients visiting more than one syringe exchange provider and not reporting the same main substance to each provider, or clients who report a different main substance at follow up visits to the same provider within the current year.

1. OVERVIEW OF EVIDENCE ON NEEDLE EXCHANGE SERVICES FOR 2012/2013

The majority of people who inject drugs (PWID) in England are believed to access Needle & Syringe Programmes (NSPs) ⁽¹⁾, suggesting that NSPs are an ideal setting to provide PWID with needles and injecting equipment, and harm reduction interventions. Despite this, evidence suggests that one third of injecting drug users injected with a needle that had been previously used and there is a need to increase the amount of equipment in England provided to PWID through NSP ⁽¹⁾.

Evidence suggests that the profile of injecting drug users is changing in terms of the main drugs that are being injected in the UK. It is believed that numbers of people who inject opiates and/or crack may be decreasing in England ⁽²⁾ although heroin remains the most commonly injected substance. Additionally, evidence indicates that the number of individuals injecting other drugs such as performance and image enhancing drugs (PIEDs) and new psychoactive substances, including amphetamines and amphetamine-type drugs are increasing ^(3, 4). This supports previous evidence from Cheshire and Merseyside on the increasing number of PIED users accessing NSP services ⁽⁵⁾.

Those who inject PIEDs and new psychoactive substances are at greater risk of blood borne virus infection in comparison with the general population. There is evidence of equipment sharing and sexual activity, including with multiple partners and male partners, amongst male PIED users ^(3, 6). There has been evidence identified amongst a sample of PIED users of HIV (1.5%), hepatitis B (9%) and hepatitis C (5%) as well as low levels of vaccination for hepatitis B and of testing for HIV and hepatitis C ⁽⁶⁾. Although they make up a smaller proportion of all injecting drug users when compared to those injecting opiates and PIEDs, there has been an increase in prevalence of injecting psychoactive drugs in the UK, including those injecting these drugs as their main drug ⁽³⁾. This population appears to be at greater risk of sharing equipment and of undetected infections than other PWIDs⁽³⁾.


This evidence indicates the challenges facing NSP in Cheshire and Merseyside. Those using PIEDs and new psychoactive substances are likely to have different needs for information and equipment and require different approaches to engagement to opiate users. NSPs may need to develop their service to further meet the needs of these client groups. For example, newly issued guidance for the provision of needles and syringes in England ⁽⁷⁾ recommends that services offer equipment and advice specifically for PIED users. Also recommended is increased monitoring of clients to allow further analysis of the drug use and characteristics of NSP clients, to increase understanding of service users.

2. AGENCY NEEDLE & SYRINGE PROGRAMME

2.1. AGENCY NSP - NEW CLIENTS

2.1.1. NEW INDIVIDUALS BY GENDER - AGENCIES ONLY

St Helens had the greatest number of new clients presenting to agencies (n=639) followed by Wirral (622) and Halton (610). The majority of new clients were male in every area, ranging from 92.7% in Sefton to 98.6% in Knowsley.



2.1.2. NEW INDIVIDUALS BY GENDER (EXCLUDING STEROID USERS) - AGENCIES ONLY

When steroid and PIED users are excluded, St Helens had the greatest number of new clients presenting to agencies (n=396) followed by Wirral (211) and Cheshire West and Chester (169). The majority of new clients were male in every area, ranging from 64.0% in Halton to 100.0% in Liverpool.



2.1.3. NEW INDIVIDUALS BY AGE GROUP - AGENCIES ONLY

The highest proportion of new clients presenting to agencies fell within the 20-24 age group (24.2%) followed by 25-29 (23.2%). The area with the highest proportion of those aged between 20-24 was Cheshire East (31.4%) followed by Liverpool (26.6%).



2.1.4. NEW INDIVIDUALS BY AGE GROUP (EXCLUDING STEROID USERS) - AGENCIES ONLY

When steroid users are excluded from the data, the highest proportion of new clients presenting to agencies fell within the 25-29 age group (18.4%) followed by 20-24 (17.7%). The area with the highest proportion of those aged between 25-29 was Sefton (22.7%) followed by Halton (21.3%).

2.1.5. MAIN DRUG OF USE FOR NEW CLIENTS - AGENCIES ONLY


Over two thirds of clients presenting to agency exchanges across the region for the first time identified steroids as their main drug of use (67.4%) followed by heroin illicit (8.5%) with all other substances recorded averaging at under 3%. Significantly of these drugs melanotin was recorded as main drug by 2.1% of clients, the third highest reported substance after steroids and heroin illicit.

2.2.1. ALL INDIVIDUALS BY GENDER - AGENCIES ONLY

Wirral had the greatest number of total clients presenting to agencies (n=1324) followed by Cheshire West & Chester (879) and Halton (713). The majority of clients were male in every area, ranging from 92.5% in Cheshire West & Chester to 99.2% in St Helens.



2.2.2. ALL INDIVIDUALS BY GENDER (EXCLUDING STEROID USERS) - AGENCIES ONLY

When steroid and PIED users are excluded, St Helens had the greatest total number of clients presenting to agencies (n=396) followed by Wirral (324) and Cheshire West and Chester (321). The majority of clients were male in every area, ranging from 67.0% in Halton to 98.7% in St Helens.



2.2.3. ALL INDIVIDUALS BY AGE GROUP - AGENCIES ONLY



2.2.4. ALL INDIVIDUALS BY AGE GROUP (EXCLUDING STEROID USERS) - AGENCIES ONLY

When steroid and PIED users are excluded, the highest proportion of total clients presenting to agencies fell within the 45 and over age group (19.6%) followed by 40-44 (18.6%). The area with the highest proportion of these clients aged 45 and over was Liverpool (41.8%) followed by Wirral (27.5%).

2.2.5. MAIN DRUG OF USE FOR ALL CLIENTS - AGENCIES ONLY

Over seven in ten of clients presenting to agency exchanges across the region identified steroids as their main drug of use (71.1%) followed by heroin illicit (10.7%), melanotan (1.5%), growth hormone (1.4%) and methadone (1.1%) All other primary drugs identified averaged across the region at under 1.0%.





















4.2.5. MAIN DRUG OF USE FOR ALL CLIENTS - PHARMACY/AGENCY COMBINED

Because of low recording of primary drug by pharmacy services, almost two thirds of the total number of clients presenting to all NSP services across the region did not identify main drug of use (64.5%).
