

INTRODUCTION:

Hello. This is the fourth quarterly report for the 2015-16 year and covers all activity for the whole financial year from 1st April 2015 – 31st March 2016. We are still missing data from some services so it's important this is entered onto IMS Online or your bespoke system as soon as possible so it can be included in the complete 2015-16 dataset which we're pulling together shortly for the 2015-16 annual report which will be published later this year.










Just a reminder that the 2014/15 annual report has now been finalised and published, detailing all IMS client activity recorded during 2014/15 across Cheshire and Merseyside, and cross matching activity recorded in IMS with client numbers from the National Drug Treatment monitoring System (NDTMS) and the Drug Intervention Programme (DIP). We are currently promoting the completion of the "NPS/Club Drug" field of the IMS dataset. This can be found in the IMS Online system on its own tab, or for agencies using their own system we have paper forms available. Already agencies in Liverpool, Wirral, Warrington and St Helens have begun routinely asking these questions to all presentees to ascertain the types of substances being used in their areas. Please let us know if you'd like to know more about this piece of work.

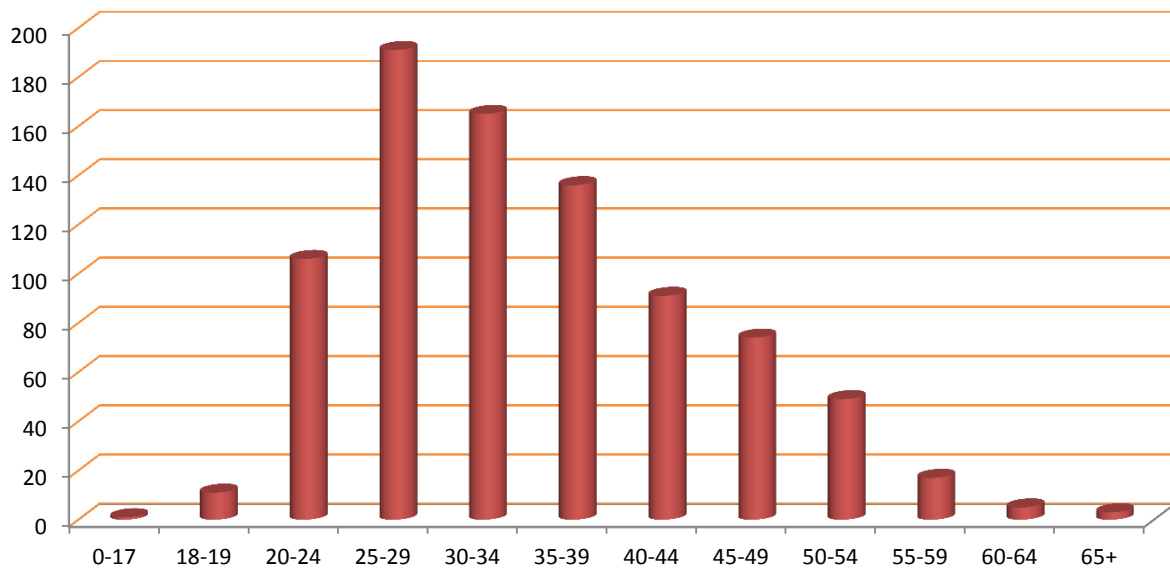

ADDITIONAL NOTES

The figure for those accessing services includes all individuals who had an intervention, an onward referral, a well being review, a health screening, or a syringe exchange transaction during the quarter.

The number of individuals shown Year to Date (YTD) is not necessarily a sum of the quarterly figures as the same individual may have presented in more than one quarter, but they will only be counted once in the YTD number. Likewise the Local Authority total is less than a sum of the agency figures where an individual has presented at multiple services during the period.

The activity summary shows the number of activities delivered by each service.

The Year to Date (YTD) activity figure is cumulative and should represent the sum of each quarterly figure, unless any retrospective changes are made to the data by the agency following their quarterly data submission.

The client review data section includes all clients who have accessed services at any time during the current year to date, and details information that is collected in the client assessment review, such as Primary Substance of use, Accommodation status, Employment Status, and Parental status.

Where the client has multiple assessments completed, only the last completed assessment has been used.

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
